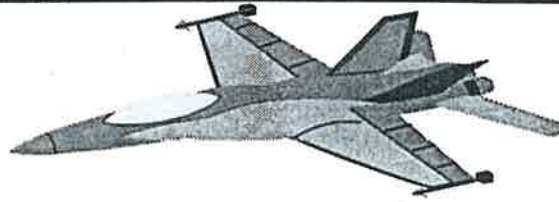

PHASE 1 FOR 1997/1998 TRAINING CALANDER

Attached is the attendance roster for the Phase 1 Course just completed. The course consisted of qualifications for Handgun and Shotgun ( Def. Tech 23 BR Bean Bag Round ). The course was held at the Bullseye Range in San Rafael. No injuries were sustained during this course. All officers who participated in this course qualified with their handgun. The shotgun was used with this course to review the Def. Tech 23 BR Bean Bag round. Officers fired 3 bean bag rounds from 5, 10, & 15 yard lines. Additionally, the training guidelines on using the bean bag as a weapon were reviewed. Officers who did not attend this course are highlighted on the attendance roster.

The course also covered review of Tactical Shooting from the Hip, Point Shoulder shooting, and using their Sights. Distance shot were from the 3, 7, 10 & 15 yard line. Approx. 150 rounds per officer were fired for training.

Each officer also shot the F.A.T.S. laser system, participating in approx. eight scenarios each. After each scenario, an instructor evaluated and reviewed the scenario with each officer. This seemed to reinforce the shooting principles taught earlier on the range.

A short review of the A.S.P. Baton was also covered, with practical application on the striking bag, and a review of proper striking areas. More work in the area of S.D.A.T. is needed to keep up current training skill requirements.

The officers also watched two P.O.S.T. videos:  
Controlling Violent Subjects part 2 and  
Arson and Explosives.

Each video was approx. 2 hours in length.

Overall, all officers did an excellent job and seemed to enjoy the training. This type of hands on tactical firearms training is very important on a regular basis to keep the officers skills tuned, and their judgement sound for critical incidents.

This class will cover a variety of topics, covering both Firearms and SDAT review. Topics covered during this phase of training will strengthen the officers skills for officer survival on the street, along with reinforcing the decision making process necessary to perform their job successfully. Topics covering Firearms and SDAT should be reviewed and practiced quarterly for the benefit of the officers retention and performance ability.

The Physics Department at the University of Chicago has been fortunate in the past few years to have had a number of distinguished visitors. These include Professor J. J. Sakurai, who spent the summer of 1961 in the department, and Professor R. E. Marshak, who spent the summer of 1962 in the department. Both of these professors have made significant contributions to the field of particle physics, and their visits have been a great benefit to the department. In addition, the department has also had a number of other distinguished visitors, including Professor S. D. Drell, who spent the summer of 1961 in the department, and Professor J. D. Bjorken, who spent the summer of 1962 in the department. These visits have helped to keep the department up-to-date on the latest developments in particle physics, and have also helped to foster a strong relationship between the department and the rest of the physics community.



**OBJECTIVE:**

The objective of this block of training is to review for the officers basic procedures and principles used during street survival tactics. This is accomplished through lecture, instructor demonstration, practical application drills, video, and testing. Also, to review with the officer the liability issues in relation to proper technique, sound decision principles, and good judgment when encountering a violent or combative subject. This is accomplished through consistent and progressive training classes.

**LOGISTICS:**

The class will be held at the Bullseye Range. We will use the Firearms range, FATS room, and the Classroom. Approx. 100 rounds of handgun ammo and 3 rounds of bean bag ammo will be shot during this class.

**INSTRUCTION:**

The course will be taught by SRPD instructors. Both lecture and hands on training will be used. During the firearms block of training, practical application drills and instructor demonstration will be used.

For SDAT, the ASP BATON drills will include slow practice and review, along with some striking bag work, review of striking area's and non-striking area's/

The FATS machine will be used to practice the officers use of force options while handling different incidents. This is a new machine and we will use it in this class to introduce the officers to a higher level training tool in the escalation of force options.

The POST Video, Controlling Violent Subjects Part 2 is a follow-up to the Part 1 video shown in March at the First Aid training class. This allows the officers to hear from other officers around the state on incidents which they were involved in, and how they survived.

**PRACTICAL APPLICATION:**

Officers will be asked to demonstrate their knowledge and physical ability on all subject matter taught during this class.

**TESTING:**

The 832 PC Handgun Qualification Course.

**SIGN-UPS:**

Sign-ups will be posted in the Patrol Briefing Room. All sergeants should schedule their personnel according to their staffing levels.
